Standing Rules

Revised March 10, 2015

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MEMBERSHIP

1. As a wedding gift, the new spouse of a Bremerton Ski Cruiser shall be automatically accepted as a member with no initiation fee or additional dues for the current year. On October 1st following the wedding, if the spouse so chooses to continue membership, the family dues will be applicable.
2. Membership limits shall be controlled by Board action.
3. Special Guests: Upon approval of the Board, a single senior member will be allowed to annually sponsor a special guest for one membership year, upon payment of dues equivalent to a family membership. The sponsored party will not vote on club business, be a Key Holder, hold office, or sponsor other guests. A Special Guest must be sponsored each time they use the cabin. A special guest is obligated to participate in the two day work party and shall abide by all other provisions of the Articles, By-Laws, and the Standing Rules. This sponsorship may be revoked by the senior member or the Board at any time without refund.
4. All completed membership applications shall be mailed to the Ski Cruisers' post office box at the Tracyton Post Office. The order they will appear in the membership Wait List will be determined by the postage date shown on the envelope. In order for applications to be accepted and voted on by the Board, they must be complete with signatures, etc.

WORK PARTY OBLIGATIONS

1. All members and Special Guests 14 years (As of October 1) and older shall be obligated to attend a two-day work party each year, unless the Building Chairman declares this unnecessary for a particular year prior to the first scheduled work party of the summer.
2. Additional work parties attended by members and special guests can be credited, at equal time value, to other members. Non-members attending work parties may have their work time credited to club members, with permission of the Board, provided the applicable work party chairman has been notified of the intent prior to the work party. All requests for credit transfers must be submitted to the Board no later than the October Board Meeting.
3. All obligated members and special guests attending the required two-day work party, or two one-day work parties, will pay regular member cabin fees during the ski year.
4. Each obligated member and special guest not meeting the above obligation will pay guest fees during the following ski season; unless they choose to pay a fine of \$200.00 and member cabin fees.

5. Each member and special guest attending one 1-day work party will be credited with one-half (1/2) of a work party toward the following summer and fall, but will pay guest fees during the immediate ski season; unless they choose to pay a fine of \$100.00 and pay member cabin fees.
6. Any member joining at, or after, the first fall meeting will pay member cabin fees for their first ski season.

CABIN RULES

1. After 10:30 PM, sleepers have priority; so quiet hours shall be observed above the first floor. On special occasions, the Cabin Chairman may designate differently.
2. The furnace thermostats are to be turned down to 60 degrees at 12:00 midnight at the latest on regular weekends and at 2:00 a.m. at the latest on party weekends.
3. At the end of each member's or Special Guest's stay at the cabin, his or her sleeping bag must be tightly rolled and tied securely and stored in the dorm.
4. Whenever sleeping in the dorms is not practical, or dorm space is not available, people will sleep in an area designated by the acting Cabin Chairman.
5. Minors shall not use alcohol or non-prescribed drugs prior to their arrival or during their stay at the cabin. Any evidence of alcohol or unlawful drug indulgence shall be cause for barring them from future use of the cabin.
6. Each member and guest will sign up for jobs on the job chart for the weekend, or accept a job as determined by the acting Cabin Chairman.
7. Any member having a complaint filed against him or her by the Cabin Chairman to the Board of Directors for failure to perform work tasks, or for the infraction of club rules, may be suspended for a definite period of time, at the Board's discretion. The accused will be requested to appear before the Board to speak in his or her own behalf.
8. There will be a maximum of 49 people sleeping in the dorms unless specifically authorized by the Cabin Chairman.
9. No electrical appliances will be allowed in the dorms, except the vacuum cleaner and medical devices. There will also be no smoking, food, gum, or drinking allowed at any time in the dorms.
10. The cabin is available for occupancy only during the ski season unless otherwise authorized by the Board. Midweek use of the cabin is permitted provided the Key Holder notifies the Cabin Chairman or President prior to attending.
11. Any community items taken to, or removed from the cabin must be approved jointly by the

Cabin Chairman and Building Chairman.

12. Smoking is not allowed in or within 25 feet of the cabin, deck or outbuilding. This statement shall be included on the membership application form.
13. No one but the Cabin Chairman, or his delegate, has the authority to cut a lock off any locker.
14. Unless authorized by the Cabin Chairman, the jukebox is to be kept locked "top and back" at all times, and there will be a charge of 5 cents per play. It is to be opened ONLY by the Cabin Chairman or his designated representative.
15. The only videos allowed to be played on electronic devices are "G" rated movies and sports related videos. Cabin rule # 11 (above) applies. PG videos are allowed after 11 PM. All members and guests using electronic devices shall not play any offensive music or videos.
16. Marijuana, smoked, ingested, prescribed by a physician for medical use, or any possession is absolutely prohibited from being on the premises of the Bremerton Ski Cruisers cabin, outbuilding, or any leased land from the Federal Government by Bremerton Ski Cruisers. Usage is acknowledged to be legal in the State of Washington, however it is not allowed on Federal Leased Land.

USE OF CABIN BY GUEST OR NON-MEMBER GROUPS

1. A. If there is no waiting list to join the club, guests eligible to apply for membership are limited to two visits per season. There are no visit restrictions for guests not eligible to apply for membership.

B. If there is a waiting list to join the club, all guests are limited to four visits unless individual extensions are authorized by the Board or General Membership.
2. Senior or Family membership is allowed to sponsor no more than one (1) family as guests at a time or a number of guests not to exceed the number of members in that membership unless otherwise approved by the Board.
3. Limited planned outside groups may use the cabin upon approval of the Board. Requests must be submitted in writing. A Key Holder and the sponsor must be in attendance.

SIGN UPS FOR THE CABIN

1. All persons staying overnight at the cabin must register their names. The authority shall rest with the Cabin Chairman to see that this register is kept current. Any person failing to register shall be subject to Board action. When registering a guest, or a junior member not accompanied by a senior member of the same family, the sponsor's name shall also be entered.
2. On special occasions as designated by the Board, bunks will be reserved and paid for previous to the occasion. They will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.
3. Sign up on the bunk list for another person is not permitted unless that person is in the Stevens Pass Ski Area and intends to remain.

KEY HOLDERS

1. Applicants for cabin keys shall be Senior or Senior Family members of the Club.
2. Request for a key is to be made through the Board.
3. After the applicant has been thoroughly checked out by the Cabin Chairman or his authorized representative on the necessary precautions and procedures for opening and closing the cabin, and has successfully gone through the procedure on two different weekends, the results will be submitted to the Board for final approval by either the Safety & Security Chairman or the Cabin Chairman.
4. A key holder's responsibility does not end with the mechanics of unlocking and securing our properties. He is considered a direct representative of the Cabin Chairman, and assumes similar responsibilities upon accepting a key. In the absence of the Cabin Chairman, a key holder shall act in his behalf.
5. If a key holder shows himself incapable of handling the responsibility, the Board of Directors shall be empowered to recall his key. Upon recall of a key, the key holder is obligated to return it at once.
6. Each applicant is required to read and agree to abide by these standing rules before being granted a key.
7. No key holder may loan his key to any other person. A key holder may, however, temporarily lend his key to another key holder provided it is immediately returned. Both Key Holders must be present at the Cabin.

JUNIORS

1. All children 12 and under must be in bed by 11:00 p.m. unless there are extenuating circumstances.

2. Junior and Junior Family Members may stay at the cabin ONLY if they are sponsored by a Senior Member.
3. Junior and Junior Family Members (13 through 17 years of age) must be retired by midnight, except on New Year's Eve and Bremerton Day, when 1:00 a.m. is the deadline. All persons under 18 not lodging at the cabin shall be required to leave the cabin by 11:00 p.m., except New Year's Eve and Bremerton Day, when 1:00 a.m. is the deadline. The 1:00 a.m. deadline may apply to other special occasions as determined in advance by the Board of Directors.
4. All children age eleven and under in the cabin must be accompanied by a parent or another Senior member arranged by the parent. Any other supervisory arrangement must be approved by the Cabin Chairman.

SKI

1. The Ski Chairman is authorized to schedule the number and types of races for the Club as deemed necessary.
2. The Club is authorized to continue the past practice of paying entry fees for any competitors participating in P.N.S.A. (U.S. Skiing) sanctioned races under the name of the Bremerton Ski Cruisers. Prior Board approval is required.
3. This fee is not to be paid until after the event has taken place and the racer or jumper has appeared at the starting gate and started.
4. Anyone desiring to participate in the Bremerton Day Club races must be a member of the Bremerton Ski Cruisers.
5. After the Bremerton Day race, the perpetual trophy will be given to the fastest times in the Junior Women's, Junior Men's, Senior Women's, Senior Men's, Veteran Women's, Veteran Men's, Downhiller Women's, and Downhiller Men's age groups. Perpetual trophies will also be awarded to the fastest Snowboard participant and for the single fastest Male and Female run of the day on the longest course. Members who win a perpetual trophy three (3) or more times in a row, will be awarded an appropriate personal plaque noting the "achievement of effort" in addition to having their name engraved on the perpetual trophy. All perpetual trophies shall be retained by the Club in the Club's Trophy Case. An individual may, however, petition the race chairman for permission to take a trophy home for the summer. The individual assumes responsibility for: Repairing any damage sustained, and returning the trophy to the Cabin during a work party in the summer.
6. The Spittoon Trophy is to be shared by the male and female racers with the fastest time on a single run on the women's longest course and the men's longest course, regardless of age.
7. Medals or trophies will not be awarded to racers that do not complete the race course. With exception of the Spittoon Trophy, medals or trophies will not be awarded to racers that do not finish both runs of the race unless the ski chairman has cancelled the second run for all

participants.

8. The Ski Chairman shall prepare and publish race rules prior to the race.
9. The Junior perpetual trophies shall be awarded to the fastest combined times on the longest courses by any competitor under the age of 18.
10. The Snowboard perpetual trophy shall be awarded to the combined fastest two runs on the longest course by a male or female and is inclusive of all ages.
11. Race Classifications:

Pee Wees Boys & Girls	12 Years and under
Junior Men & Women	13-17 Years of age
Sr. Men	18-44 Years of age
Sr. Women	18-39 Years of age
Veteran Men	45-59 Years of age
Veteran Women	40-59 Years of age
Down Hiller Men & Women	60 Years of age and older
Snowboard Man or Woman	of all ages.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. The Recording Secretary is to keep a list of all Club property, where it is, and who has it.
2. The Board meetings can be held in private homes.
3. No pets will be allowed at the cabin.
4. Since the power and telephone bills, rent for the meeting hall, rent for the Post Office Box, Safety Deposit Box, insurance, taxes, sewer, and land use are bills that must be paid, the Treasurer will automatically pay these bills upon receipt of the statement.
5. All general meetings convened for the conduct of business such as elections and by-law amendments will be held in Kitsap County or at the cabin.
6. All members are prohibited from revealing the cabin lock combination to non-members. A special guest may receive the lock combination, with approval of the Board, and is also prohibited from revealing the combination.
7. Members and guests shall not leave their skis, boots, poles or sleeping bags at the cabin or outbuilding during the summer months. Articles left at the mountain will be considered “abandoned” and shall be disposed of by the Cabin Chairman as directed by the Board.

DUES AND FEES

1. Locker fees shall be \$20.00 per year. It is suggested that there be a minimum of two persons per locker. Only paid up members may rent lockers.

2. Annual locker rental fees are due and shall become delinquent on the same dates as membership dues. If a locker rental payment is not received before delinquency, the locker shall be considered available for rental. New members will not be automatically assigned a locker. New members must request a locker before being assigned a locker or added to the locker wait list. Lockers shall be assigned as available from a priority waiting list prepared by the Cabin Chairman and presented at the September General Membership meeting. All requests for lockers shall be mailed to the Ski Cruisers' post office box at the Tracyton Post Office. The order they will appear in the Locker Wait List will be determined by the postage date show the envelope. Subsequent additions to the list shall be added in the order they are received and shall comply with the following priorities:
 - A. Family.
 - B. Senior, where no locker is assigned to a Family or another Senior with immediate family relationship.
 - C. Senior whose immediate family relation(s) have a Family or Senior locker.
 - D. Junior.
 - E. The application of the priority rule only applies within the calendar year in which application was received. If not enough lockers are available to be assigned during the calendar year, the member's position on the locker waiting list is retained.

3. Cabin Use Fees are as follows:
 - A. Overnight:

Member:	Age 13 and under - \$4.00
	Age 14 and over - \$8.00
Guest, any night:	Age 13 and under - \$8.00
	Age 14 and over - \$16.00

 - B. The cabin Chairman shall receive free lodging.

4. Dues are as follows:

Junior - \$60.00 (14-17 on October 1st)

Senior - \$170.00 (18 and over on October 1st)

Family - \$240.00

When joining after February 15, dues for the remainder of the current membership year will be one-half the regular annual dues. This does not apply to former members unless at least one full year break in membership has occurred. In all cases, full initiation fees apply.

5. Key holder fee - \$5.00
6. Initiation fees are as follows:
 - A. Junior Members - \$500.00
 - B. Senior members - \$500.00
 - C. Family Members - \$500.00
