

Directions to Bremerton Ski Cruiser's Cabin at Stevens Pass



Stevens Pass is located about 50 miles East of Monroe on US Highway 2. From the south and central Puget Sound, take Hwy 522 off of I-405 East to Monroe. From the North, take US Hwy 2 off of I-5 East to Monroe. Monroe is the last of the large towns as you drive up. It has plenty of restaurants and chain grocery stores, if you need to eat or pick up some last-minute items for your stay. As you drive from Monroe towards Stevens Pass, you will travel through several small towns; Sultan, Startup, Gold Bar and Skykomish. Most of these towns have a place or two to eat, buy gas or groceries as well.

As you come around the last corner approaching the ski area, you will see some buildings and a chair lift in front of you and the speed limit will reduce to 35. There is a right-hand turn lane. Turn right into the parking area but stay on the left as you pull away from the highway (highlighted in green on the map). The parking lot will veer to the right as you enter Lot 3. Keep driving all the way through Lot 3 and then it will turn pretty sharp left as you enter Lot 4. The ski area wants the overnight cars to be parked on the outside edges of Lot 4 (highlighted in red on the map). Stay to the right and in the farthest corner of the lot from where you entered there is a trail that leads to the cabin (highlighted in pink). The trail is for walking or riding only, no cars allowed.

Find a place to park along the edge of the parking lot and call your sponsoring member to let them know you are here. If they are not at the cabin, you should wait until they are in the parking lot to help you get to the cabin. The walk from the cabin is approximately a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile and is uphill. Many use a backpack to haul clothes and coolers or totes to haul the food. It is easiest to load all of your gear onto a sled and drag it up to the cabin. As you walk up, you will pass a cabin on the left, then a ways further at a sharp left turn in the trail, there will be another cabin in front of you, keep going around the corner. Usually some skiers or snowboarders will pass you on the way, try not to take up the entire trail. The Ski Cruiser's cabin is a 4 story, dark green cabin with cream trim on the left. Once at the cabin, ring the doorbell and your sponsor will come let you in. There is a day lock code to enter the cabin. The rules of the ski club do not allow your sponsor to share the code with you.

Once you are in, your sponsor will help you store your gear, sign up for a bunk, sign up for a job and settle in for an enjoyable stay at the cabin. This is a communal living environment and there could be as many as 50 or so other people up here enjoying the cabin and winter activities available to them. Make sure you mark your personal items and keep track of them.

The cabin costs for guests are \$16/night ages 14 and above, \$8/night ages 13 and under. Please pay the night you arrive, checks can be made to BSC.
